Pupils take part in The Gruffalo author's singalong in Oxford



A MAGICAL woodland tale of a daring mouse and a feared beast was brought to life before hundreds of Oxfordshire children. Award-winning children's author Julia Donaldson, creator of The Gruffalo, joined pupils on stage in Oxford yesterday for a live singalong. Tunes were taken from her songbook 'A Treasury of Songs', featuring original songs based on her stories Room on the Broom and The Gruffalo. More than 900 youngsters from 28 schools learnt some of the songs and took part in three separate performances at the Centre for Music in Barton yesterday. Jess Gray, central area manager for Oxfordshire County Council's Music Service, said it was a 'privilege' to welcome the celebrated author. Children from primary







schools from across the county enjoyed the singalong in front of a packed audience made up of fellow pupils, friends and family. ## **E-SAFETY TIPS FOR PARENTS AND CHILDREN**

It's important to be aware of technology, toys and internet safety. That's because over the next few years, millions of objects will be connected to the internet. You might have already bought an internet-connected gift for your child, so it's important to be aware of the potential risks.

## What is the Internet of Things?

The Internet of Things, sometimes called the IoT, refers to everyday objects that connect to the internet. Internet of Things devices can be activated using voice commands and can be controlled remotely using a







smartphone app. Lots of these devices are also Bluetooth-enabled, meaning they are able to connect to nearby devices, without having to connect to the internet.

#### Internet of Things examples include:

- smart speakers, such as Google Home and Amazon Echo
- wearables, such as Fitbit and Apple Watch
- smart meters measuring household energy consumption.

#### What is the Internet of Toys?

Along with the devices above, many toys now connect to the internet. This is sometimes referred to as the Internet of Toys. These products include:

- toys with voice and/or image recognition, such as Hello Barbie<sup>™</sup> and Furby Connect
- app-enabled robots, drones and other mechanical toys, such as Dash and Dot.

#### What are the risks of internet-connected devices?

Because IoT devices can feel unobtrusive in the home, you may not realise they pose the same security risks as more conventional devices, such as smartphones and tablets. This means you could be more relaxed about your security when using them. In reality, these devices collect personal data, often both audio and visual. These devices might also be vulnerable to hacking, as there are no safeguards or security standards for internet-connected objects.
