SCIENCE FAIR

What would happen if I put raisins in a tall jar filled with soda water?

Bayards Hill Science Week began on Monday, creating a real buzz throughout the school.

To launch Science Week, Monday's assembly featured lots of 'what if' scenarios, presented by Andy from Science Oxford, such as, what would happen if I dropped an orange, a lemon and a lime in a bowl of water?

Then, throughout the week, scientists from Cheney School, Oxford University and Science Oxford visited the school to run a variety of workshops and shows exploring a range of topics, from magnetism to convection, and investigating the 'magic' of science!

On Thursday afternoon, we held our second Bayards Hill Science Fair. At the fair, KS2 children demonstrated their experiments and research to KS1 children, governors, parents and visiting scientists. The hall was packed, and excited customers were treated to lots of interesting installations and hands-on demos - from learning about the solar system and eclipses, to disappearing coins (through the process of refraction) and 'upside-down' water – with the science behind all of these thoughtfully explained by our KS2 children. The results of the voting will be out soon.

Please also encourage your child to enter our Big Science Question competition for the term. Remember the question is 'What would happen if the sun went out?' and written entries are to be submitted to Mr Waite by week 6 of this term (with prizes for the best answers).

Andy also mentioned the famous feather and hammer drop on the moon experiment – just google 'feather hammer moon' and you can watch a Youtube video of the outcome.
